Games with Number Cards



- Order the Cards
 - Using a set of number cards, mix up the cards and have your child put them in correct numerical order
- Sequence Cards
 - Using a set of number cards, lay a series of two cards down to represent a sequence of three, with one card missing, i.e. 1, 2, ___. Child says 3.
 - Or 8, ___, 10, child says 9, etc.
 - Hardest is usually this number sequence: ___, 7, 8, where the first number is the one missing.
- Trace the Numbers
 - Using a set of number cards, have child lay a plastic page protector over them and trace them with shaving cream or a watercolor marker.
 - Or, build with play dough or cheerios or string licorice.
- Number Card Bingo
 - Using a set of number cards and Bingo chips, give child a number card and have him or her count out and build a set of that many Bingo chips.
 - Vary the counters you use, i.e. buttons, blocks, animal crackers, cheerios, etc.
- Using a Bingo card you've made for your child with numbers in the spaces (including some you know he or she doesn't recognize yet), give child Bingo chips, and have him or her play Bingo as you draw from a deck of number cards.
